

It will be difficult to fully describe the impact that Thrive Outside and the Teacher Learning Circle (TLC) have had on my practice and beliefs as an educator.

I have been lucky as an educator to work in multiple public charters and now in the public school system of Rhode Island. These experiences have provided me with firsthand experience in seeing the inequities surrounding our children, environmental education, and basic access to the outdoors.

I walked away from our first session enthusiastically, with community contacts, incredible hands-on activities and the knowledge that outdoor education, in an under-served community, IS POSSIBLE.

My students THRIVED OUTSIDE.

This led to us bringing out quilts and reading and writing outside. Soon we buddied up with a

kindergarten class and began reading outside with them every Friday. Students grew more confident, calm, and their behaviors decreased.

From the TLC I was not only able to gain valuable lessons for my students, I gained the confidence to share my experiences with my peers.

At the end of the year, I was able to engage my peers in professional development where they were able to engage in many of the same hands-on activities that I learned about through the TLC.

I believe my experience only again reaffirms how important it is to get children outside and engage with the world around them.

There is an incredible amount of inequities in our world. Accessing and learning about the outdoors should not be one of them.


